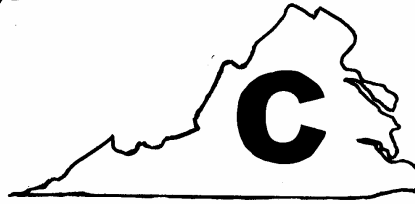

Dues

CVCA dues are \$50 for all producers. Dues need to be paid by January 31 of each year. Membership runs by the calendar year (January 1 – December 31). Only producer members in good standing can purchase supplies at CVCA discount prices, participate in CVCA sponsored sales, etc.

MARKETING PROGRAM

Requirements To Be Able To Sell With CVCA

CVCA In-Barn Sale Requirements (Virginia Cattle Company)

- Member
- Calves must be weaned on farm 45 days in advance of take-in date for sale.
- Calves need to have (2) 7-way shots, and one (2) Bovishield Gold 5, (1) One Shot, dewormed, and tagged with a CVCA or VQA tag.
- Minimum weight of calves is 400 lbs.
- Calves will be owned 60 days prior to sale.
- Source verified and birth dates are recommended
- All shorts must be given to calves between four months of age and two weeks before the sale.
- Vaccinations must be done per label directions and processing map filled out.
- Calves must grade muscle score #1 or #2 to sell. Consignors are responsible for taking any reject cattle back home on all take-ins for special CVCA sales.

Pre-condition Commingling Program

- Member
- Calves must be weaned on farm two weeks in advance of take-in date.
- Calves need to have (2) 7-way shots, (1) Bovishield Gold 5 on farm before delivery.
- Calves will be given Bovishield, One Shot, and de-wormed at take-in.
- Home raised and source verified with birth dates.
- Minimum weight 400 lbs.
- Chares for Glenmary Farm (Tom Nixon) or John Goodwin to precondition calves are set by Tom Nixon and John Goodwin. All payment should be made directly to them.
- Calves are fed at both locations at owner's risk for death or injury to calves. CVCA does not assume any risk nor provides any insurance on calves.

Breeding Heifers

- Take in dates: March, 2008 and October, 2008
- \$50 deposit due at take-in.
- Heifers will be bred AI and exposed to clean up bulls for 45 days.
- Heifers will be listed on the "For Sale" page of the CVCA website (www.cvcacattle.com) as they become available for purchase.
- Heifers must be up-to-date on vaccinations and can be Bangs vaccinated at the farm conducting the Heifer Development Program.
- Bred heifers will be sold on the first Friday in April at the Culpeper BCIA Sale.
- Charges to precondition heifers are set by farm conducting the Heifer Development Program. All payments should be made directly to them.
- Calves are fed at owner's risk for death or injury to calves. CVCA does not assume any risk nor provides any insurance on calves.

MARKETING PROGRAM (continue)

CVCA Sale Dates

- CVCA sale dates will be announced throughout the year. For more information on sale dates contact Steve Hopkins at (540) 672-1361 or visit the website at www.cvcacattle.com.

CVCA Guarantee

- Members selling in CVCA sales assume all responsibilities and liability for assuring that the required vaccinations according to DVCA rules were given to calves. Members selling in source and age verified sales also assume all responsibility and liability for assuring source and age verification. Members selling source and age must be certified to sell in the Southeastern Livestock Network (SLN) Processed Verified Program (PVP).
- Heifers sold in CVCA feeder calf sales are guaranteed to be open. If the buyer has a veterinarian determine that a heifer is bred, the seller of the calf will be required to reimburse the buyer \$200 per bred heifer. Failure to do so will forbid the sellers opportunity to sell in CVCA sales until payment is made.
- Steers sold in CVCA feeder calf sales are guaranteed not to be stags or bulls. If the buyer purchases a stag or bull, the seller will be required to reimburse the buyer \$150 per stag or bull calf. Failure to do so will forfeit the sellers opportunity to sell in CVCA sales until payment is made.
- CVCA does not assume any liability for calves delivered to the market or collection point.

SERVICE AND SUPPLY

MINERALS

- Orange-Madison Co-op is the supplier for 2008.
- A delivery and price schedule is included in this handbook. Note that Mix B and Mix B CTC have 2% less Phosphorus as the A mixes, but more salt. Some members had requested this, and it is in line with what many nutritionists around the country are recommending.
- Please pay attention to the order dates and times and the pick-up dates and times. We request that you double-check your order and your payment to insure accuracy. **Check and order forms for minerals must be received one week prior to delivery of minerals or your order will not be placed.** Mineral orders must be picked up on the designated day and time.
- CVCA is not responsible or liable for any damage of missing orders left after pick-up times.
- Trucks are loaded at the direction of the people picking up minerals.
- Only one (1) ton increments will be sold.

PHARMACEUTICAL AGREEMENT

- Animal health products under the CVCA purchase agreement are available at the Orange-Madison Co-op (OMC) locations. OMC will not accept credit/debit cards or individual charges for these products. You must pay with cash or check. Dr. Pat Comyn, DVM in Madison, is also handling animal health products in that area.

Renter shall be responsible to CVCA for needed repairs due to negligence of the renter. It is the renter's responsibility to walk around the equipment before hook up and note any physical damage visible at that time.

Before head catch/squeeze chute is returned, it shall be washed and cleaned thoroughly. If parts are missing or lost, the renter shall pay CVCA the cost for new replacement parts.

In addition, I have liability insurance on the towing vehicle and driver that extends to the head catch/squeeze chute, and scale that meets or exceeds \$300,000. I also certify that my liability insurance is in full force and effect will remain so until the head catch/squeeze chute and scale is returned.

APPLICATION FOR USE OF CATTLE TUB (continue)

Tub rental shall be \$75 per seven (7) days use including pickup and return.

Renter should bring additional help to hook up tub. Do not depend on CVCA farm where kept to furnish labor for hook up.

Renter shall be responsible to CVCA for needed repairs due to negligence of the renter.

It is the renter's responsibility to walk around the cattle tub (closed position) before hook up and note any physical damage visible at that time.

Renter shall report any defect (open position) found when setting up equipment on their farm that was not visible at time of pickup.

Before cattle tub is returned it shall be washed and head catch and center post tub gate fittings greased and cleaned thoroughly.

Additional Fees:

The renter shall be obligated to pay a fee of \$25 per day in the event that the cattle tub is returned later than shown on Page 8.

If parts are missing or still on the farm where used, the renter will be assessed an additional \$25 per day until missing parts are returned.

Should parts be missing or lost during transport, the renter shall pay CVCA cost for new replacement parts.

The renter shall be obligated to pay a fee of \$50 in the event that the cattle tub or chute is returned without being cleaned.

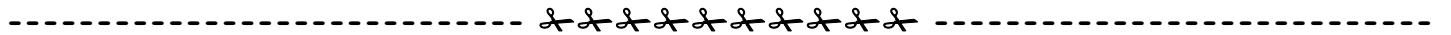
